## THE PERKINS BASS PAPERS

The papers of the Honorable Perkins Bass were presented to the Manuscript Collections Division of the New England College Library in 1972 by former Congressman Bass.

The collection is comprised of five general groups of manuscript records. The papers are arranged in file cases and several Paige-boxes.

The first category consists of the pre-Congressional files, 1935-1955 (1 case: File 1);

The second category contains the campaign files, 1954-1956, 1962 (3 cases, 1 Paige box: Files 2-5);

The third group is comprised of the Congressional files (84th-87th Congresses), 1955-1962 (22 cases, 1 Paige box: Files 6-28);

The fourth section includes general political files and correspondence, 1961-1962 (3 cases: Files 29-31);

The fifth and final group contains photographs (1 case, 1 Paige box: Files 32, 33), tapes and films (1 case: File 34), press releases (2 cases: Files 35, 36), miscellaneous correspondence and financial records (1 Paige box: File 37), and miscellaneous pamphlets (1 Paige box: File 38).

In addition, the Perkins Bass Collection contains 14 scrap-books (1954-1962), assorted memorabilia, and a collection of books which includes the following sets: Manuals of the General Court (1905-1961), U.S. Statutes at Large (1947-1961), and Hearings Before the House Committee on Science and Astronautics (86th and 87th Congresses).

The 38 cases total approximately 25,000 items. Congressman Bass' correspondents include: President Eisenhower, Vice President Nixon, Sherman Adams, Secretary of the Interior Fred Seaton, Secretary of Agriculture Ezra Benson, President Kennedy's Administrative Assistant, Lawrence O'Brien, and members of the White House staff.

Former Congressman Bass is the son of the late Governor Robert P. Bass (R-N.H., 1911-1912) and Edith H. (Bird) Bass. From 1941 to 1942, Bass was law clerk to Judge Woodbury of the First Circuit Court of Appeals. During World War II, he was awarded the Bronze Star Medal, and he received the Yun-Ma Medal from the Nationalist Government of China for distinguished and meritorious service. He was discharged from the Air Force with the rank of Major.

Since 1946, Bass has been a partner and member in the law firm of Sheehan, Phinney and Bass in Manchester, New Hampshire. A trustee of the New Hampshire Savings Bank, Bass is also a director and member of the Executive Committee of Bird & Son, Inc., East Walpole, Massachusetts. In addition, he is a past president of the Monadnock Community Hospital in his home town, Peterborough, New Hampshire.

Bass is and has been active in many civic organizations in his community and state. As U.S. Congressman from the second district, Bass served on the Banking and Currency, Public Works, and Science and Astronautics Committees of the House of Representatives. In 1960, he became a member of the Republican Policy Committee of the House. A leader of the liberal wing of the New Hampshire Republican Party, he became that party's nominee for the U.S. Senate in 1962.
