This collection is comprised of the diaries and personal accounts of William H. Abbott, a cabinetmaker, which he kept in yearly volumes of standard pocket diaries from 1857 to 1893. They include information such as weather, travel, hours worked each day, who he saw, letters written, and jobs accomplished.

Collection Overview

Biographical Information

William H. Abbott was a cabinetmaker in Fisherville (now Penacook), New Hampshire, though he told the 1880 census enumerator that his business was "shipping carriages." He was born about 1837 in Massachusetts to Jacob and Harriet Abbott. He had a sister, Ami M. Dunklee (Mrs. G. W.), and a relative, perhaps a brother, Jacob Abbott, in Nashua, NH.

William H. Abbott married Adaline (Addie) Connor, daughter of Asa and Esther (Farington) Conner, born in Boscawen on January 10, 1838. They had one child, Alice, born February 9, 1867 in Concord. William died at Concord on August 21, 1896; Addie died there on April 1, 1904.

Collection Scope and Content Note:

The William H. Abbott Papers, 1857-1893, primarily contain the diaries and accounts of William H. Abbott, a cabinet maker in Fisherville, NH. Diary and personal account entries were kept

intermixed in yearly volumes of standard pocket diaries. Entries include weather, travel, hours worked each day, who he saw, letters written, and jobs accomplished. For example: Wednesday, April 30th, 1860, "finished a job of 50 four dr bureaus." Also included are also receipts for groceries, milk, lumber, and city water. Other materials in this collection include correspondence, bills and receipts, newspaper clippings, advertisements, a volume of names of members of the Baker Memorial M.E. Church and Congregation, and the bylaws of the Kearsarge Savings Bank and the Horace Chase Lodge, No. 72.

Scope and Content: Series A consists of the diaries, account books, and time books of William H. Abbott, dating from 1860 to 1890, with one undated volume. The diaries include daily entries on the weather, personal visitors and visitors to town, the hours he worked, and some references to his work in cabinetmaking.

Series B. Correspondence, 1857-1893

Extent: 3 folders

Scope and Content: This series contains correspondence from 1857 to 1893. The letters cover a number of topics including a house and land for sale; family correspondence with daily updates; life insurance correspondence and receipts; and a few Civil War letters from Hilton Head and Beaufort, SC, and St. Augustine, FL. Also included is a letter from Nehemiah G. Ordway at the U.S. House of Representatives discussing updates on his farm and a meeting notice for the Horace Chase Lodge, No. 72.
