The Asa W. Bartlett Papers, 1806-1907, contain documentation of the 12th New Hampshire Regiment's service in the Civil War, as well as Asa Bartlett's efforts to arrange reunions and sponsor a monument at Gettysburg.

Collection Overview

Biographical Information:

Asa W. Bartlett was born in Epping, NH, on August 29, 1839 to Richard and Caroline Olive (Williams) Bartlett. The youngest of nine children, he grew up in the town of Pittsfield, NH, and attended Pittsfield Academy. After he graduated, he was a teacher in the Pittsfield and Barnstead district schools. At the age of nineteen, he moved out West to Illinois where he taught school and studied law.

He returned to New Hampshire in 1862 and it was shortly after his return that he enlisted with the 12th Regiment New Hampshire Volunteer Infantry on August 21, 1862. Bartlett earned the rank of Captain and participated in the battles of Chancellorsville, Swift Creek, Relay House, Drury's Bluff, and Port Walthall. He was mustered out on March 18, 1865 due to illness and

later became the official historian for the 12th regiment, writing a book called, *History of the 12th Regiment New Hampshire Volunteers in the War of Rebellion*.

After the war, he passed the New Hampshire Bar and became a lawyer. He practiced law in Merrimack and Hillsborough counties. He married Finette Almeda Doe (1842-1894), daughter of John and Abigail (Davis) Doe, on December 4, 1867 and together they had one son named Richard Bradley Bartlett (1878-1944). Bartlett was a member of the Grand Army of the Republic post in Pittsfield. He helped to organize reunions and worked on getting a monument for the 12th New Hampshire Regiment in Gettysburg.

His wife, Finette, died on July 2, 1894 in Pittsfield. Asa Bartlett died on February 16, 1899 in Pittsfield.

Collection Scope and Content Note:

The Asa W. Bartlett Papers, 1860-1907, represents Bartlett's documentation of the service of the 12th New Hampshire Regiment in the Civil War and his efforts to arrange reunions and sponsor a monument at Gettysburg. These materials include orders and official documents, court martials, and reminiscences for the 12th Regiment. The papers also include programs, newsletters, signatures, and correspondence from efforts to organize reunions for the 12th New Hampshire. The collection also includes materials on the history of the 12th New Hampshire, which Bartlett kept as official historian of the regiment.

Some items of note include a newspaper clipping about President Grant visiting Manchester, NH (folder 8). Another item of note is the 1899 Twelfth New Hampshire Volunteers Association Annual Reunion program (folder 13). This particular item features an image of Captain Asa W. Bartlett on the cover of the program.
