#### Collection Overview

#### **Biographical Information:**

Harold Webster Cate (1884-1958) was born to Edwin J. and Mary (Stratton) Cate at Lawrence, MA. In 1920 he was farming at Antrim, NH, and working as an insurance agent by 1930. An undated calling card in the collection indicates that he worked at some point for "Agricultural Service, Inc" in Concord, NH. He did not marry, and the 1950 census identified himself as a composer.

In the 1940s and early 1950s, he copyrighted and published a number of patriotic songs, mostly marches. The collection also contains a self-published 1930 pamphlet and several poems.

#### **Collection Scope and Content Note:**

This small collection of the papers of Harold Webster Cate (1884-1958) consists primarily of documentation of his patriotic musical compositions written in the 1940s and early 1950s. There are many receipts for mailing material to the U.S. Copyright Office between 1944 and 1945, but

the collection contains only one copy of a piece with both words and music, as well as a few poems. Other details of his working and personal life are not present.

The photographs are of himself, his mother, and a few friends, notably an undated one of composer Amy Cheney Beach. Another item of note is a thank-you letter from Sherman Adams from the White House dated April 9, 1954.
