Abstract:

Alice Cosgrove (1909-1971) was an artist and for twenty-five years she worked at the State of New Hampshire Department of Planning and Development. The bulk of the collection consists of printed materials produced as part of her job with her state. Other material in the collection includes some correspondence, original sketches, drafts for printed items, and Christmas cards. The materials date from 1928 to 1971.

Collection Overview

Biographical Information:

Alice (Ericson) Cosgrove was born in Concord, NH, to Eric and Sophia Ericson on February 16, 1909. She was the youngest child of Sonia and Eric Ericson. After high school in Concord, she attended the Museum of Fine Arts School in Boston, MA. She married Roland Cosgrove (1900-1968), also an artist, and they lived in Boston. Their daughter Joanna was born in 1931.

Work was difficult to find during the Depression so Alice and her daughter returned to the family home in Concord where Cosgrove began working for the Works Progress Administration Federal Arts Project. One of the projects she completed under this program was the Mother Goose murals at the Way School in Claremont, NH. During World War II, she worked for Hoyt Electrical Instruments drafting precision dials. Alice Cosgrove started with the State of New Hampshire Department of Planning and Development in 1946, a position she held for twenty-five years. She designed various promotional materials for the state. One of her more well-known designs was the character of Chippa Granite, a boy she used in various projects and who became so popular that contests were held for a few years to find a real-life look-alike. She designed a postage stamp for the 150th anniversary of the discovery of the Old Man of the Mountain, which was issued June 21, 1955. She designed the clay figure used as the model for the Marine Memorial in Hampton and also designed parade floats to represent the State of New Hampshire for the Presidential Inaugurations of John F. Kennedy in 1961 and Lyndon B. Johnson in 1965. Alice Cosgrove retired in 1971 and died on December 7, 1971.

Collection Scope and Content Note:

The Alice Cosgrove Papers consists of few original sketches, drafts for printed items, Christmas cards, etc., but the bulk of the collection consists of printed materials produced as part of her job with the state. There is little personal information about Alice Cosgrove. The materials are dated 1928 to 1971.

Some of the items in this collection include various drafts for a New Hampshire Commemorative Stamp featuring the Old Man of the Mountain, which can be found in the New Hampshire commemorative stamps folder. Another item of note would be a letter from New Hampshire Governor Wesley Powell congratulating her on fifteen years of service to the State of New Hampshire, which can be found in the correspondence and press releases folder. Another would be a press release from the Office of James C. Cleveland discussing the inauguration of Lyndon B. Johnson as President of the United States, also found in the correspondence and press releases folder.

In the printer materials folder, there is a sketch of John F. Kennedy in a vehicle with multiple children accompanied by a quote from him. The Marine Monument folder offers a look into the creation of the Marine Memorial on Hampton Beach, NH, that Cosgrove designed. The monument honors the all of the New Hampshire men and women lost at sea during times of war. The cover of a magazine within this folder shows a picture of Alice Cosgrove with the monument. There are also materials related to her character Chippa Granite. He can be seen in many of her projects throughout the collection, and there are also materials related to the contests to find a real-life look-alike scattered through several folders.
