The Wood Family Papers contain the correspondence, deeds, ephemera, family writings, photographs, and genealogical research of the Wood family as compiled by Reverend Sumner Gilbert Wood. The documents date from 1794 to 1938, with additional genealogy notes by John C. Chadbourne in 2011.

## Collection Overview

### **Biographical Information:**

Sumner Gilbert Wood was a reverend and writer born in Boston, MA, on May 23, 1855, son of Franklin and Pamela (Huntley) Wood. He attended school in Waltham, MA, graduating in 1877 before attending Andover Seminary, from which he graduated in 1880. He married Emma Frances Chadbourne on March 24, 1881 at Williamstown, MA. The daughter of Sylvester and Harriet (Walters) Chadbourne, Emma was born about 1859 at South Berwick, ME. Sumner and Emma had three children: Robert Franklin (1883- ), Horace Winbourne (1885- ), and Stanley Chadbourne (1895-1895).

Wood went on to serve as pastor of several churches, including the New Ipswich, NH, Congregational Church from 1880 to 1883; the Third Congregational Church in Fall River, MA, from 1883 to 1888; the First Congregational Church in Easthampton, MA, from 1888 to 1901; the Congregational Church at Blandford, MA, until fall 1911; in Winchester, NH, until 1922; and in East Berkshire, VT, until 1924. After retirement, he moved to West Medway, MA. During his life he also wrote several books, including *The Taverns and Turnpikes of Blandford, 1733-1833*

in 1908; *Ulster Scots and Blandford Scouts* in 1928; and *Soldiers and Sailors of the Revolution from Blandford, Mass.* He died in Framingham, MA, on September 25, 1942. Emma died on October 8, 1946 at Holliston, MA.

**Collection Scope and Content Note:**

The Wood Family Papers consist of correspondence, deeds, ephemera, family writings and stories, photographs, and genealogical research of and by the Wood family from 1794 to 1938. The materials in this collection were collected by Reverend Sumner Gilbert Wood, who passed them on to his son Horace Winbourne Wood. They were then given to Fred Garland Barber in about 1978 and then to John C. Chadbourne. Chadbourne provides numerous notes throughout the collection, primarily with the correspondence. These notes, written in 2011, contain information on the author and recipient, including their dates and relation.

The correspondence consists primarily of letters to and from family members in Orange and Alstead, NH. Other towns represented include Acworth, Columbia, Gilmanton, Lebanon, and Meriden, NH, and Boston, Easthampton, and Fitchburg, MA. The majority of letters are to or from Benjamin Wood Jr., Zeruah Waldo, Horace Wood, and John Wood. Other materials include deeds from Benjamin Wood, Gilbert Wood penmanship and daguerreotype advertisements, obituaries, poetry, family writings, a photograph of Paul Ansel Chadbourne, and photographs of houses.

The family genealogy includes research notes and genealogical charts for the Wood, Waldo, Huntley, and Chadbourne families and includes an application to the Daughters of the American Revolution by Elizabeth A. Wood.
