#### **Abstract:**

James B. Woodman (1879-1958) was a physician in Franklin, New Hampshire. He was primarily a surgeon and was affiliated first with a private hospital, Sanborn Hall, and then with the Franklin Hospital. The papers in this small collection consist of a household expense book (1910-1916), marriage certificate and list of gifts received, records of his service in World War I in France, and letters from patients and other physicians between 1926 and 1940.

#### Collection Overview

#### **Biographical Information:**

James B. Woodman (1879-1958) was born on January 12, 1879 in Lebanon, New Hampshire, the son of a physician, Milton S. Woodman and his wife, Mary Emma (Morey) Woodman. He graduated from Dartmouth College in 1900 and Dartmouth Medical School in 1903. In 1904, he became associated with John W. Staples, a physician in Franklin, New Hampshire, and in 1906 they opened Sanborn Hall, a private hospital, with Woodman as Surgeon. Upon the death of Dr. Staples in 1913, it closed, and Woodman's professional affiliation continued with Franklin Hospital, the staff of which he was on until his death. Dr. Woodman served in the U.S. Army in World War I, organizing and commanding a 2,000-bed surgical hospital at Beau Desert, France. In addition to membership in various civic and fraternal organizations in Franklin, he was a member and officer of several medical organizations, among them: the Merrimack County Medical Society, the New Hampshire Medical Society, New Hampshire Surgical Society, and New England Surgical Society.

James Woodman married Ethel Everett on October 15, 1910 at Wollaston, MA. She was the daughter of Willard E. and Ida E. (Woodbury) Everett, born on January 30, 1884 at Montague, MA. Ethel had three children born at Franklin: James B. Jr. born April 13, 1913; Everett born February 11, 1916; and Dorothy (married Howard Hatch) born November 25, 1925.

James died at Franklin on June 28, 1958; Ethel died in July 1982.

#### **Collection Scope and Content Note:**

The James B. Woodman Papers offer a glimpse of the professional life of a mid-twentieth-century surgeon in a small New Hampshire city. There are a few brochures of the private hospital he and a colleague owned and operated between 1906 and 1913 (but no other records of it), and letters from patients and colleagues from the mid-1920s to 1940. Patients thanked him for his care and for cancelling their bills; colleagues asked his advice and thanked him for the care given their patients.

Woodman's non-professional and family life is undocumented except for a household expense memorandum book kept between 1910 and 1917. There are only a few items from his World War I experience: a few postcards he sent his wife and children, and his discharge papers. The collection contains a few small objects: his service ribbon and identity discs from World War I, a German Medal from World War I (a souvenir), three pocket watches, a watch chain with a seal and small tag engraved "Dr. Jim 1-19-55 from your hospital family," and a medal commemorating the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the founding of Franklin, New Hampshire.
