Collection Overview

Biographical Information:

Cabinetmaker Alejandro de la Cruz was born in Madrid, Spain, in 1924. He apprenticed to a cabinetmaker at the age of 14. His father was killed during the Spanish Civil War, and de la Cruz was struck in the face by shrapnel when he was 12 during the Siege of Madrid. He later deserted the army and made his way through Portugal to Mexico and South America.

He came to the United States in 1945 for a series of operations on his face in New York and then on to New Hampshire to recover at the home of Walter Come in Canterbury. De la Cruz then established his cabinetmaking business at a building he leased, then purchased, from the Shakers.

De la Cruz became a United States citizen with the assistance of Senator Styles Bridges, who introduced a bill to Congress granting citizenship. He married Concepcion Dolores Navajos of Madrid in 1968. In 1986, he sold his home and workshop to David Lamb, a former apprentice

who continues a cabinet-making business. He retired to the southern coast of Spain with his wife. He died from a heart attack in Spain on May 26, 1990.

Collection Scope and Content Note:

The Alejandro de la Cruz Papers, 1949-1985, consist primarily of printed material about Alejandro de la Cruz, furniture maker, craftsman, and furniture restorer of Spain and Canterbury, NH. The correspondence in this collection largely has to do with his immigration record, reports, and the Congressional bill to grant him U.S. citizenship. Much of this is to or from Senator Styles Bridges. Other correspondence in this collection relates to his career, exhibits, and from his doctors regarding surgery to fix a facial injury.
